• c. 4,000 BP

Ancestors of the Songhees (Lekwungen) occupy the area now known as the City of Victoria

• 1700s

- Fortified village of the Songhees stands at Finlayson Point
- 1778 Captain James Cook discovers Nootka Island
- 1790 Spanish expedition of Manuel Quimper in the *Princesa Real* reaches Esquimalt (Puerto de Cordova)

1837 Captain William McNeill surveys the harbours around Victoria aboard the *Beaver* 1840

- The 1842 James Douglas sights Victoria (Whosaykum) aboard the schooner Cadboro
- 1843 James Douglas arrives via the *Beaver* and establishes Fort Camosun (later Fort Victoria) as a Hudson's Bay Co trading post
- 1844 The HBC forces the re-location of the Songhees village across the harbour
- The Quamichan warrior Tzouhalum leads an attack on Fort Victoria

- 1847 St. Charles Roman Catholic Church established at Esquimalt
- 1849 Crown colony established
- The HBC expands Fort Victoria
- Influenza epidemic reaches Victoria, killing at least 3
- The HBC establishes the Company School with the Rev. Robert Staines as Head
- **•** 1850
 - The Songhees begin abandoning their winter villages around Fort Victoria
 - Richard Blanshard, first Governor of Vancouver Island, arrives at Victoria
 - 1851 Blanshard resigns his post and leaves
 - Set Edward E. Langford arrives at Victoria
 - Robert Dunsmuir arrives at Victoria
 - 1852 Helmcken House built

- Farm Director Kenneth McKenzie completes the Craigflower Schoolhouse
- 1856 First House of Assembly election
- 1858 Fraser river gold rush begins
- Crown Colony of British Columbia established
- 1859 Britain assumes direct control of Vancouver Island
- 1860
 - Solution Victoria Rifle Corps militia established
 - Race Rocks and Fisgard lighthouses built
 - 1862 City of Victoria incorporated
 - Smallpox epidemic decimates the Songhees nation
 - 1864 Telegraph system begins operation
- **•** 1865
 - Sequimalt Harbour becomes the Royal Navy's Pacific headquarters
 - 1866 Vancouver Island and British Columbia colonies united
 - Mifflin Gibbs, the first Black politician in Canada, elected to the Victoria Town Council
 - Gold rush ends
 - 1867 Confederation
 - 1868 Victoria becomes the capital of British Columbia
 - 1869 Fire completely destroys Christ Church Cathedral
- ☞ 1870
 - 1871 BC joins Canada
 - Pacific Telegraph Hotel, the largest of its day (150 beds), opens on Store St
 - 1872 Second Christ Church Cathedral built
 - Royal Navy stations 5 ships and 1,800 men in Esquimalt
 - All public schools close for lack of funds
 - 1873 The international Financial Panic causes the Federal Government to renege on the plan to make Victoria the Pacific terminus of the Canadian Pacific Railway
- 1875
 - SS Pacific sails from Esquimalt and collides with the SS Orpheus, resulting in the loss of 230 out 232 souls
 - The Water utility begins piping in from Elk Lake
 - 1877 James Douglas dies
 - Pendray Soapworks starts at Humboldt and Douglas, producing 40,000 lbs of soap per week
 - 1878 John A. Macdonald becomes MP for Victoria

- Victoria & Esquimalt Telephone Company begins operations with 50 subscribers
- 1882 Princess Louise arrives for a 2 week visit, stays for three months

- Chinese archway erected at Store Street for Governor General's visit
- 1883 Robert Dunsmuir acquires remaining interest in Departure Bay mines for \$600,000
- 1884 Chinese Benevolent Association established in Victoria
- Thinese population is 15,000, equal to the white population

- 1883 Victoria begins replacing gas lighting with electric lighting
- 1886 Esquimalt and Nanaimo Railway completed
- 1887 Esquimalt dry dock completed
- Work Point Barracks established as a Canadian military base
- 1888 The Esquimalt and Nanaimo Railway reaches Victoria
- 1889 Rudyard Kipling visits Victoria

1890

- First street cars begin operation
- 1891 The CPR Empress line begins service between Vancouver and Victoria
- 1892 Economic depression begins
- 1893 First phase of construction begins on the British Columbia Parliament Buildings
- 1894 Victoria and Sidney Railway begins service

1895

- Table 1896 Point Ellice Bridge collapses, killing 55 streetcar passengers on board
- ☞ 1897 An estimated 100,000 immigrants arrive en route to the Yukon gold fields
- 1898 Official Opening of the Parliament Buildings
- Belle Adams murders Charles Kincaid by cutting his throat with a razor
- 1899 Willows Exhibition Building constructed in Oak Bay

1900

- 1901 Queen Victoria dies
- 1903 Rattenbury and Maclure complete Government House
- The Canadian Bank of Commerce hires poet Robert Service as a clerk
- Victoria College opens
- 1904 The CPR's Princess Victoria begins service between Victoria, Vancouver, and Seattle
- Opening of the Butchart Gardens

1905

- 1906 The Royal Navy removes 1000 personnel from the base in Esquimalt
- The steamer Valencia sinks off the west coast, drowning 120
- 1907 Willows Exhibition Building destroyed by fire
- 1908 The Empress Hotel opens
- 1909 The Chinese Imperial School (renamed The Chinese Public School in 1912) opens on Fisgard St

- 1910
 - The Arcade Block fire destroys an entire city block from Government at Fort to Trounce Alley
 - 1911 Songhees Band accepts a cash deal for \$434,000 to transfer lands on Victoria Harbour to the province
 - 1912 Height of the Victoria real estate boom
 - Canada's first artificial ice surface hosts first professional hockey game in Western Canada at Oak Bay
 - 1913 John Bryant dies in Canada's first fatal plane crash
 - 1914 B.C. purchases two submarines to defend the coast
- 1915
 - More than 1150 volunteers deployed with the 30th Battalion on the Princess Mary
 - Angry mobs vandalize German-owned businesses like the Kaiserhof Hotel in response to the news of the sinking of the Lusitania
 - 1917 The Legislature gives women the vote in provincial elections
 - Tieutenant Colonel Arthur Currie captures Vimy Ridge in the First World War
 - Ogden Point breakwater completed
 - 1918 Dominion Astrophysical Observatory completed

- Ogden Point docks completed
- I Willows School built
- Victoria College resumes sessions at Craigdarroch Castle after five-year hiatus
- ☞ 1922 Federal MPs launch a campaign to segregate Chinese schoolchildren
- 1924 Johnson St. Bridge opens
- Leper colony moves from D'Arcy Island to Bentinck Island, remaining there until 1956

• 1925

- Victoria Cougars defeat the Montreal Canadians three games to one to win the Stanley Cup
- 1926 Second Esquimalt drydock completed
- The second secon
- 1928 Emilly Carr travels to eastern Canada to meet the Group of Seven
- 1929 The SS Empress of Canada runs aground off Albert Head
- Son Winston Churchill visits Victoria

1930

- The Naden Band forms
- 1931 Police seize 40,000 tickets for a Canadian National Lottery
- Mount Doug High School built
- The Legislature bans Alexandra Tolstoy from BC for fear of inciting Sons of Freedom radicals

1933 Five people report seeing "Caddy", a 24 metre-long sea monster off Cadboro Bay

1935

- Glenlyon Boys' Preparatory School moves to the former residence of Francis Rattenbury in the same year of his murder
- 1937 U.S. President Franklin D. Roosevelt visits the Capital City
- Canadian Government acquires Hatley Park upon the death of Mrs. James (Laura) Dunsmuir
- 1938 Premier Duff Patullo submits proposal to Royal Commission to ban immigrants of Chinese and Japanese origin
- 1939 King George VI and Queen Elizabeth visit the Capital City

1940

- 1941 Six vacant lots are turned into Thunderbird Park
- 1942 Japanese submarine I-25 torpedoes the VMD-built freighter SS Fort Camosun in the Strait of Juan De Fuca
- Japanese sub fires at lighthouse and wireless station at Estevan Point
- Columbia Pictures shoots The Commandos Strike at Dawn in Victoria
- 1943 Fifteen year-old Anneta "Molly" Justice is stabbed to death near Swan Lake

☞ 1945

- Emily Carr dies
- 1947 The Chinook begins plying the waters between Victoria and Seattle
- 1948 Nancy Hodges named Speaker of the Legislature, a first in Commonwealth countries
- Treation of the Greater Victoria Water District
- End of streetcar service
- **•** 1950
 - Three HMCS destroyers deployed to Korea from Esquimalt
 - 1951 Princess Elizabeth and Prince Philip visit Victoria
 - Beginning of the Swiftsure Lightship Classic
 - 1953 Premier W.A.C. Bennett's Socreds re-elected
 - 1954 Mayor Claude Harrison threatens to burn "communist" books in public library

- 1956 Marilyn Bell swims Juan de Fuca in record time
- Solution World's tallest free-standing totem pole erected
- 1957 The second Government House (1905) burns down
- The fifth and last remaining "Birdcage" Parliament Building burns down
- 1959 Government House rebuilt
- S.J. Willis High School built at former site of Hillside Jail

- 1961 W.A.C. Bennett introduces bill to take over B.C. Electric Company as a Crown Corporation
- 1962 Mungo Martin dies
- 1963 University of Victoria Founded
- Alice Munro and then-husband James move to Victoria and open Munro's Books
- 1964 Victoria Conservatory of Music Founded

1965

- New YWCA YMCA Centre opens
- 1966 W.A.C. Bennett's Socred party wins another election
- The Provincial Government creates the CRD
- 1967 Centennial Train leaves for a cross-Canada exhibition
- The Federal Government gives Chinese Canadians full citizenship rights

1970

- 1971 Tourism becomes Victoria's largest employer
- Three day Constitutional Conference held to amend the BNA
- Camosun College founded
- 1972 The NDP, led by Dave Barrett, unseat the Socreds after seven consecutive elections
- Frank Arthur Calder named to Dave Barrett's cabinet, becoming the first native cabinet minister

☞ 1975

- Socreds beat the NDP in provincial election
- Renovations begin to convert a group of derelict warehouses into Market Square
- In 1977 Fire destroys CN Rail's 140,000 square-foot warehouse at Ogden Point
- 1978 The first class of girls ("Harvey House") attends St. Michaels University School
- 1979 VIA Rail passenger service begins from Victoria to Courtenay

1980

- More than 400 boats compete in the Swiftsure Lightship Classic in the Inner Harbour
- 1982 Royal visits by Queen Elizabeth II, the Duke of Edinburgh, and the Prince of Wales
- The province transfers public transit from BC Hydro to the newly-formed BC Transit
- 1983 Construction begins on a new \$1.2 billion multi-lane highway connecting Nanaimo and Victoria
- 1984 Spinnakers becomes the first brewpub to open in Canada

- 1985
 - Steve Fonyo completes his cross-country "Journey for Lives" after reaching Mile 0 of the Trans-Canada Highway
 - Solution Victoria's first female Mayor, Gretchen Brewin elected
 - 1986 The Royal BC Museum Centennial
 - 1988 Duke of Edinburgh visits
 - Two UVic rowers die when two 8-man shells capsize in a freak storm on Elk Lake
 - 1989 The Victoria Eaton Centre opens on the former site of Marks and Spencer

• 1990

- Derik Lord (17) of Saanich and David Muir murder Muir's mother and grandmother for inheritance money
- 1991 Four year-old Michael Dunahee goes missing from a playground at Blanshard Elementary
- 1992 Ocean Pointe Resort and Spa opens
- 1993 Integrated Ferry Constructors completes the Spirit of British Columbia in Victoria
- 1994 Greater Victoria hosts the Fifteenth Commonwealth Games

1995

- Royal Roads Military College restructured as Royal Roads University
- 1996 the Blizzard of '96 drops a record 2-day total of 124 cm on the city, causing damages in excess of \$200 million
- 1997 Fourteen year-old Reena Virk is murdered by a "swarm" of six of her peers
- The Major renovations to the Masonic Hall at 650 Fisgard
- 1998 Music producer David Foster awarded the Order of Canada

- F Hatley Castle becomes Xavier's School for the superhero film X-Men
- Solution Victoria hosts the Twenty-First BC Summer Games
- ☞ 2001 Iona Campagnolo becomes the 1st female Lieutenant Governor of B.C.
- Fip-Hop group Swollen Members release Platinum-selling album Bad Dreams
- 2002 Nelly Furtado's "I'm Like a Bird" wins the Grammy Award for Best Female Pop Vocal Performance
- 2003 BC Ferries ceases to be a Crown Corporation and becomes a independent company
- 2004 Mr Floatie is created to bring public awareness to Victoria's lack of a sewage treatment system

- ☞ 2005
 - Save-On-Foods Memorial Centre hosts the Ford World Men's Curling Championship
 - Phoenix Suns Point Guard Steve Nash wins Most Valuable Player in the NBA for 2004-2005 (repeated in the 2005-2006 season)
 - Steven Point becomes the 1st Aboriginal Lieutenant Governor of B.C
 - 2008 Thirteen percent of Team Canada at the Beijing Olympics is from Victoria
 - 2009 The MV Ocean Lady docks at Ogden Point with 76 Sri Lankan refugee claimants on board
 - Restaurant owner Peter Lee kills four family members and himself in Oak Bay
- **•** 2010
 - The 2010 Winter Olympics cross-Canada torch relay begins in Victoria
 - The Completion of the Atrium building, a LEED-certified office space
 - Two teenage boys murder 18 year-old Kimberly Proctor and burn her body
 - 2012 V&Q Celebrates 150 years
 - 2013 Congregation Emanu-El Celebrates 150 years
